Topic: The <u>Bible</u> Key Thought: We can <u>trust</u> our <u>source</u>.

Matthew 28:19 "Go...make disciples of all nations...teaching them to observe all I have commanded you." They were entrusted with the words of Jesus, "the words of eternal life."

Our Goals for the series:

- A couple of questions...
- 1. Why were the New Testament books and letters originally written?
 - To be an <u>authoritative</u> witness of the <u>life</u> and teachings of Jesus.



2. How was the New Testament compiled in its present form?

- With <u>sober</u> judgment.
- There were other writings, letters, books and so-called accounts of Jesus that were circulating.
 - Lost books or (secret) books <u>Gnostics</u> wrote them between 150-400 AD.
 - <u>Pseudopigrapha</u> So-called accounts of Jesus' life, written under the name of someone credible by a discredited source. These were written mostly from 150 AD to 400 AD.
 - <u>Gospel</u> accounts, about 40 that surfaced over the first 250 years of Christianity. These books were known to the early church to be discredited and false sources.
- <u>Apocrypha</u> Refers to a group of books added to the Old Testament by the Roman Catholic Church at the Council of Trent (1548).

Matthew 5:17-19 – The Law, Prophets and the Writings.

Takeaway 1 – No matter how many <u>facts</u> we bring regarding the Bible, we enter into its teachings by <u>faith</u> in Jesus Christ.

Takeaway 2 – We have the Bible because the early disciples <u>fulfilled</u> their <u>responsibility.</u>
