DIGGING DEEPER

We are going to circle back around to a passage we studied in the first week of this series to help us recognize how important PRAYER is as our first step.

Nehemiah 2:1-5(NLT)

In the month of Nisan, in the twentieth year of King Artaxerxes, when wine was before him, I took up the wine and gave it to the king. Now I had not been sad in his presence. ² And the king said to me, "Why is your face sad, seeing you are not sick? This is nothing but sadness of the heart." Then I was very much afraid. ³ I said to the king, "Let the king live forever! Why should not my face be sad, when the city, the place of my fathers' graves, lies in ruins, and its gates have been destroyed by fire?" ⁴ Then the king said to me, "What are you requesting?" So I prayed to the God of heaven. ⁵ And I said to the king, "If it pleases the king, and if your servant has found favor in your sight, that you send me to Judah, to the city of my fathers' graves, that I may rebuild it.

Keep your conscience clear. Then if people speak against you, they will be ashamed when they see what a good life you live because you belong to Christ.

12) What is "earnest prayer", and how should we apply this to our neighbors?

CHAIR TIME TOOL

This week sit down and prayerfully work through the following questions.

- Who were you with when you gave your life to Jesus?
- When, or about when, was it?
- What did you want Jesus to do for you?
- What was your life like before Jesus, and what difference has Jesus made for you?

Not everyone can remember these details for various reasons, however, Jesus remembers, so ask Him to remind you. It may be that you were young when you

gave your heart to Christ and that is awesome. What decisions has Jesus saved you from?

FAMILY RESOURCES

Read Matthew 28:19-20 and 1 Peter 3:15-16 with your children. Then, answer the following questions as a family:

13) What does it mean to be a disciple?

If your children have not yet asked Jesus into their hearts to be their Lord and Savior, now is a good time to do so. Explain to them that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God and that even though we try to do our best, we all make mistakes (Romans 3:23). When we do things that are wrong, those wrong choices separate us from God (Isaiah 59:2 and Romans 6:23). But, God loves us so much that He didn't want to be without us. So, He sent His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for our sins (Romans 5:8). All we have to do is confess our sins, ask God to forgive us and ask Jesus into our hearts to be the Lord and Savior of our lives (Romans 10: 9-10, 13). Guide them through the prayer if they are ready, and then celebrate!
