#### Matthew 4:17-25 (ESV)

<sup>17</sup>From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

#### Jesus Calls the First Disciples

<sup>18</sup>While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. <sup>19</sup>And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." <sup>20</sup>Immediately they left their nets and followed him. <sup>21</sup>And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. <sup>22</sup>Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

### TAKING IT HOME

#### Matthew 4:23-25 (NLT)

<sup>23</sup>Jesus traveled throughout the region of Galilee, teaching in the synagogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And he healed every kind of disease and illness. <sup>24</sup>News about him spread as far as Syria, and people soon began bringing to him all who were sick. And whatever their sickness or disease, or if they were demon possessed or epileptic or paralyzed—he healed them all. <sup>25</sup>Large crowds followed him wherever he went—people from Galilee, the Ten Towns, Jerusalem, from all over Judea, and from east of the Jordan River.

10. In verse 23 some translations say "Gospel". The NLT says "Good News"; what does this mean?
11. How does a person normally respond to good news? (Not referring to the gospel, just good news in general.)
12. If the Good News is forgiveness being available through repentance and God's Kingdom arriving here on earth, why is it difficult for many to share?
13. In verse 23 what else was Jesus doing?
14. How did the crowds respond to Jesus because of the healings?
15. How would you have responded if you lived during His day and heard about Jesus healing people?

**One Main Point: The posture of repentance invites HOPE.**

**Matthew 4:17–25**

***“Come and Follow Me” (Vs 19)***

- This is about movement.
- Into the known
- Into the unknown

***“I will show you how to fish for people” ... “Catch people for God.” (Vs 19 TPT)***

- Moving away from My Plan B to God’s Plan A is about ME...
- Moving away from My Plan B to God’s Plan A is about OTHERS...
- My life’s purpose PRESUPPOSES...I serve others.

**Challenge:**

- Follow Him to whatever hope He is waving you into.
- WHO will I serve? HOW and WHEN? What GOOD will I do?
- Follow Him into the uncomfortable! Both the known and the unknown.
