Fight Fear by winning a battle in my HEAD.

The first thing Gideon had to do was to face the false thinking in his own head. This does not mean he did not still feel afraid, but it does mean that he stepped out into obedience in the face of opposition. I am convinced that this is the hardest battle each of us must face.

5) What was Gideon afraid of? In what ways can you relate to Gideon's fears?

Fear stops us from seeing who God is - "The Lord is with us"

6) How else can fear stop us from seeing who God is?

Fear stops us from seeing who we are - "Mighty Warrior"

- 7) God calls Gideon a *Mighty Warrior*. How did Gideon see himself?
- 8) How does fear stop us from seeing our identity in Christ, and why is that important?

Fear sends my head space to the wrong place – "Gideon was threshing wheat in a winepress"

- 9) How can fear send your head into the wrong place?
- 10) Have you ever feared something completely imaginary? If so, what was it, and did it come to pass?

There is a progression of battles we need to fight regarding fear in our lives. The first place is almost always within our head in our belief systems. Then we need to step into our home and fight the fears there.

Fight Fear by winning a battle in my HOME.

25 That night the Lord said to Gideon, "Take the second bull from your father's herd, the one that is seven years old. Pull down your father's altar to Baal, and cut down the Asherah pole standing beside it. 26 Then build an altar to the Lord your God here on this hilltop sanctuary, laying the stones carefully. Sacrifice the bull as a burnt offering on the altar, using as fuel the wood of the Asherah pole you cut down." (Judges 6:25-27 NLT)

27 So Gideon took ten of his servants and did as the Lord had commanded. But he did it at night because he was afraid of the other members of his father's household and the people of the town. (Judges 6:25-27 NLT)

The third place we need to "fear less" is in our community. This does not mean the city you live in but the people sitting in your Life Group with you. These are our friends, hopefully. It also means other places you are intimately connected with, for example, the family and people you allow to influence you.

Fight Fear by winning a battle in my COMMUNITY.

- 14) Have you ever been afraid of sharing honestly in your Life Group? If so, how did it impact your connection in the group?

The last and final place we need to win the battle is in the crowd—this means the world. Gideon listened to God and encouraged those around him to imitate his actions of obedience.

17 Then he said to them, "Keep your eyes on me. When I come to the edge of the camp, do just as I do. 18 As soon as I and those with me blow the rams' horns, blow your horns, too, all around the entire camp, and shout, 'For the Lord and for Gideon!'" (Judges 7:17-18 NLT)
