Thread: As followers of Jesus, we pay attention to which _____we're having.

²⁷ "But to you who are willing to listen, I say, love your enemies! Do good to those who hate you. ²⁸ Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who hurt you. ²⁹ If someone slaps you on one cheek, offer the other cheek also. If someone demands your coat, offer your shirt also. ³⁰ Give to anyone who asks; and when things are taken away from you, don't try to get them back.³¹ Do to others as you would like them to do to you.

Luke 6:27-31 NLT

HOW DO I LIVE LIKE THAT?

 "Do to others as you would like them to do to you." Luke 6:31 NLT How do I love my enemies?

If I would ask you to do something for me, then I should be willing to do the same for you.

- Context to this verse: Uses hyperbole to make a point.
- Jesus is presupposing you will use wisdom.

"Don't throw your pearls to pigs! They will trample the pearls, then turn and attack you." Matthew 7:6 NLT

³² "If you love only those who love you, why should you get credit for that? Even sinners love those who love them! ³³ And if you do good only to those who do good to you, why should you get credit? Even sinners do that much!³⁴ And if you lend money only to those who can repay you, why should you get credit? Even sinners will lend to other sinners for a full return." Luke 6:32-34 NLT

More hyperbole to stretch my faith.

Challenge yourself to go much further than you think reasonable.

WHAT IS MY GOAL?

³⁵ "Love your enemies! Do good to them. Lend to them without expecting to be repaid. Then your reward from heaven will be very great, and you will truly be acting as children of the Most High, for he is kind to those who are unthankful and wicked. ³⁶ You must be compassionate, just as your Father is compassionate." **Luke 6:35-36 NLT**

- Why is "love for my enemy" my goal?
- I had better not speak something from or on behalf of God that He has not spoken.

What so many are doing:

³⁷ "Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn others, or it will all come back against you." **Luke 6:37a NLT**

Judge = Pronounce as guilty and unredeemable. Condemn = Pronounce the eternal sentence.

Most people want to have an honest conversation about their life.

- The #1 quality non-Christians and those NOT belonging to a church look for in a person to talk about faith with is: "Listens without judgement."
- 62% of Americans are looking for this from the other person.
- 34% know a person like this.

Your Father in heaven is waiting to reward you.

"Forgive others, and you will be forgiven.³⁸ Give, and you will receive. Your gift will return to you in full—pressed down, shaken together to make room for more, running over, and poured into your lap. The amount you give will determine the amount you get back

WHAT AM I SUPPOSED TO DO OR THINK?

"First get rid of the log in your own eye; then you will see well enough to deal with the speck in your friend's eye.

⁴³ "A good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. ⁴⁴ A tree is identified by its fruit. Figs are never gathered from thornbushes, and grapes are not picked from bramble bushes. ⁴⁵ A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart. **What you say flows from what is in your heart.**" Luke 6:42b-45 NLT
