Thread: Let me introduce you to the heart of God. (The Bible Part 2)

"In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He existed in the beginning with God.³ God created everything through him, and nothing was created except through him. 4 The Word gave life to everything that was created, and his life brought light to everyone. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it... 9 The one who is the true light, who gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. 10 He came into the very world he created, but the world didn't recognize him. 11 He came to his own people, and even they rejected him. 12 But to all who believed him and accepted him, he gave the right to become children of God. 13 They are reborn—not with a physical birth resulting from human passion or plan, but a birth that comes from God. 14 So the Word became human and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son... 17 For the law was given through Moses, but God's unfailing love and faithfulness came through Jesus Christ. 18 No one has ever seen God. But the unique One, who is himself God, is near to the Father's heart. He has revealed God to us." John 1:1-18 NLT

Why were the New Testament books and letters originally written?

 To be an _____ witness of the _____ and teachings of Jesus.

How was the New Testament compiled in its present form?

- With sober judgement.
- Over the years there were other writings, letters, books and accounts of Jesus that would surface.
 - Lost books or (secret) books Gnostics (These were written between 150-400 AD)
 - o Gospel of Philip, Judas
 - **Pseudopigrapha** Written under the name of someone credible by a discredited source.
 - Were written mostly from 150 AD to 400 AD as well.
 - Wisdom of Solomon
 - Gospel accounts (Jesus' stories) about 40 surfaced over the first 250 years of the church.
 - **Apocrypha** Refers to a group of books added to the Old Testament by the Roman Catholic Church at the Council of Trent (1548).
 - o "Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No, I came to accomplish their purpose. 18 I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not even the smallest detail of God's law will disappear until its purpose is achieved."

Matthew 5:17-19 NLT

 The churches were brought together for councils in Rome (382), Carthage (397), and Laodicea (419) not deciding which books were Holy scripture, but to officially recognize as a whole what book the churches had always been using.

Takeaways:

- 1. No matter how many facts we bring regarding the Bible, we enter into its teachings by <u>faith</u> in Jesus Christ.
- 2. We have the Bible because the early disciples <u>fulfilled</u> their <u>responsibility</u> to connect Jesus to the next generation after them.

Challenge:

- TRUST the SOURCE with your life.
- What are you knocking on God's door for?
- Follow Jesus to the life He means to lead you to.
- Pray for the opportunities to come like Paul's introduce rather than exclude.
