If something goes beyond what's convenient, then the response is often, "I don't have the time or energy to go that direction." If it's quick, I'll take it. If it doesn't require me to go out of my way, then I'll do it. If it boosts my confidence, mood, and motivation, then I'm in.

There's nothing inherently wrong with that—don't get me wrong!

However, Jesus calls us to something much deeper. He says

in Luke 9:23–24, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

What a statement!

Jesus calls us to deny ourselves, take up the cross, and follow Him.

The cost of following Jesus is far greater than our own convenience. But what does that truly mean?

So here's the question:
